

Bantams Fall to Carolina Dynamo

Columbia, SC- The SC United Bantams hosted the Greensboro, NC-based Carolina Dynamo in their second home game of the 2016 season on Thursday, May 26 at 8 pm at Brookland-Cayce Stadium. In a hotly contested match, both teams battled the full ninety minutes with the Bantams coming up just short in a 1-0 loss.

Carolina Dynamo, who in the South Atlantic division, started off their first season with a 1-0 loss against Charlotte Eagles and a 3-0 win against South Georgia Tormenta FC. The win against the Bantams improves their season to 2-1-0.

This was the third league game for the Bantams in a single week, having drawn with Tri-Cities Otters on Saturday, May 21 and a 3-2 victory over Peachtree City MOBA on Tuesday, May 24. They fought hard and maintained possession of the ball the majority of the time, but had difficulty in finding the back of the net.

The Bantam's backline made it tough to get in behind, however one of the Dynamo's only good shots got past the Bantam's keeper. The Bantams strikers did their best to create chances and get a result, but were denied. The team kept up the intensity until the final whistle in hopes of evening the score however the late flurry of activity was dangerous but denied by the crossbar.

The Bantams' General Manager, Lee Morris, was disappointed to see his team not get the outcome they wanted, but still had confidence in his team. "We were proud of the guys tonight. I think they really had a go against one of the best teams in the division and I feel like we were the better team," said Morris about his perspective of the game. He later went on to say, "I think that we've played three teams very competitively and even though we are disappointed to only produce 4 points, if we keep continuing raising the bar in each game we will produce a winning season."

The Bantams are 1-1-1 in league play and will be on the road next week in their West Virginia campaign to play the WV Chaos and Southern WV King's Warriors on Thursday, June 2 and Saturday June 4.
