Bantams Earn Second Win against the West Virginia Chaos

Columbia, SC- The SC United Bantams played their fourth home game of their 2016 season against the West Virginia Chaos on Friday, June 24th at 6 pm at Brookland-Cayce Stadium. After ninety minutes of playing in searing heat, the Bantams were successfully able to obtain yet another win over the West Virginia Chaos by ending the game with a score of 2-1.

The Chaos, who are currently 8th in the South Atlantic division, currently have a record of 1 win, 2 ties and 4 losses. They were looking for a win against the Bantams to avenge their earlier loss to the Bantams in West Virginia. They were also looking to improve their record but they were unsuccessful in stopping the Bantams power forwards and strong defense.

This was the ninth league game for the Bantams in their season, having a current record of now 5 wins, 2 ties, and only 2 losses.
