

Bantams Dominate King's Warriors

Columbia, SC - The SC United Bantams won a critically important conference game on Wednesday, July 13, in their match up versus the Southern West Virginia King's Warriors. This match was a crucial win in the Bantams final push for a berth in the Eastern Conference playoffs.

The Bantams and King's Warriors came into the match tied in the division with records of 6-3-3. With the Charlotte Eagles leading the division and in position to win the conference outright on points, this made way for an exciting night of soccer as the tie for third place in the division meant a hotly contested match that would determine playoff hopes for only one of these teams.

The Bantam's backline had a solid game, only allowing the King's Warriors to score one goal on a defensive takeaway that was one of the few scoring opportunities they had in this match.

Herbert Cojulun got the Bantams on the board after capitalizing on an opportunity to break through the King's Warriors defense and taking a left-footed shot past the keeper. Scoring again to earn a brace, Cojulun found the back of the net after Leandro Browne's long throw-in was flicked on by Davis Bryan to Cojulun. The final Bantams goal came from a Joe Vyner header in the 68th minute to seal the win for the Bantams.

The Bantams close out the regular season on Friday, July 15, at 6 pm at Brookland-Cayce Stadium in another critical match vs Tormenta FC from Statesboro, Georgia.
